Sue Grossman Still Water River Greenway Mile Markers

Thanks to Ansis Bergs, a community member who made the homemade wood signs, and the City of Torrington for installation. Trail users now know how far they have traveled along the 3.5- mile one-way trail. Annually thousands of people use the greenway including walkers, joggers, runners, bikers and other "wheels".

Projects in Progress

Winchester's Mad River Recreation Area Trail Improvement Project

One of the cornerstones of Fit Together's Mission is to create accessible, low cost exercise opportunities for all community members.

Steps Made to Date:

- Hired Barton & Lojuidice a multi-disciplinary consulting firm to design a three-phase trail project plan with engineered concept map
- Hosted community information session at Little Red Barn Brewery
- Supported the Town of Winchester's CT Recreational Trails Grant application which was awarded at 60K for phase one project design
- Advocated for phase one construction

- We awarded 19 mini grants to partners working to create healthier environments & experiences.
- We've advocated for Farm to School food programs & healthy choices in school lunch menus.
- We've assisted Winchester in receiving a \$60K CT DEEP Trails planning grant for Mad River Recreation trails.
- Advocating for Mad River Recreation Area trail improvements and support of the Sue Grossman greenway extensions connecting Torrington & Winsted.

Fit Together Celebrates its 5210 Gold Partners

These gold level sites were identified because they instill a positive relationship with food and enthusiasm for healthy choices by promoting evidence-based strategies such as limiting or eliminating sugary drinks, promoting water as the drink of choice, prohibiting the use of food as a reward, limiting unhealthy choices during snacks and celebrations, and providing opportunities for physical activity outside of recess on a daily basis.

They also offer practice specific, obesity prevention program components that include providing consistent 5–2–1–0 messaging in offices.

Fit Families at New Opportunities Inc.

Fit Together include fun group physical activities for kids, special community guest speakers for adults and a variety of nutrition and cooking lessons for the whole family.

Topics included: Healthy Quick Breakfasts and Snacks, Eating Well on a Budget, Active Living Tips and Resources, Mindfulness, Mental Health Support, and Youth Substance Use Prevention.

Weekly program partnered with Charlotte Hungerford Hospital, EdAdvance and Torrington Public Schools to provide healthy cooking lessons and fun physical activities.





YMCA's Camp M.O.E., a day camp in Litchfield County for boys and girls aged 5–15 years, has been providing campers recreational activities and social skills for over 10 years.

This year, I had the pleasure of conducting an eight-week "Fun Fit" program through a partnership with YMCA and Fit Together. The daily program began with one-hour fitness games that kept kids moving and having fun, followed by a one-hour session of preparing a healthy snack that they were able to take home and share with their families. The kids were enthusiastic about trying healthy new foods and the self-confidence they experienced by recreating the snacks at home, which included power balls, fruit skewers, and smoothies.
